Research shows that children who have access to larger vocabularies have greater reading comprehension and general academic success. So how does reading stories help? Because stories contain vocabulary words not used in daily conversation, this is an excellent way to expand vocabulary. The content of the stories also provide listeners with new information and concepts to expand their understanding of the world.
